About Bluebirds

Bluebirds only lay 1 egg per day. This particular nest is made of pine needles. Three eggs laid so far. Bluebirds usually lay 4-5 - sometimes 6 or 7. Second and third broods tend to have fewer eggs. This is a second brood for this pair. Occasionally an Eastern Bluebird will add feathers to a nest.
