Transmission fluid lubricates the moving parts of your transmission. You should check your fluid every 30,000 to 60,000 miles in a manual transmission car. Failure to do so can cause your transmission fluid to become contaminated with bits of metal from the bearings, synchronizers and gears.

How to Troubleshoot a Manual Transmission That Will Not ...

A manual transmission requires the driver to operate the gear stick and clutch in order to change gears (unlike an automatic transmission or semi-automatic transmission, where one (typically the clutch) or both of these functions are automated). Most manual transmissions for cars allow the driver to select any gear ratio at any time, for example shifting from 2nd to 4th gear, or 5th to 3rd gear.

Make sure the clutch of a manual transmission is fully pressed when shifting; Do not use excessive force when shifting a manual. For rear wheel drive (RWD) vehicles, avoid driving through places at the minimum of the vehicle's clearance. Come to a complete stop before going from a forward gear to reverse.
